

JUVENILE COURT DRESS CODE

PLEASE NOTE:

THIS DRESS CODE APPLIES TO ALL JUVENILE COURT PROCEEDINGS AND TO ALL SCHEDULED MEETINGS WITH JUVENILE PROBATION OFFICERS.

THE COURT MAY DIRECT THE BAILIFF TO REMOVE ANY PERSON FROM THE COURTROOM FOR VIOLATION OF THIS CODE.

TOPS

- Must cover shoulders. Halter tops, tube tops, and spaghetti straps are not allowed.
- Must cover waist of the bottom apparel. The abdominal area shall not be exposed. There can be no gap, front or back, between the pants and top.

BOTTOMS

- Must fit and be worn at the waist ("sagging" is NOT permitted)
- Must be at or below the knee
- Must not drag on the floor

SHOES

- Footwear must be worn at all times and securely fastened
- No shower shoes or bedroom slippers
- No flipflops

HATS AND HEADWEAR

- Must be removed before entering the courtroom or upon meeting with your probation officer
- No combs or picks shall be worn in the hair
- No sunglasses shall be worn over the eyes or on top of the head

GENERAL PROHIBITIONS

- No stretch Lycra, Spandex or nylon tights, leotards, transparent clothing, biker pants or underwear worn as outer garments
- Clothing must not have holes or be ripped
- No apparel shall display obscene words, pictures or designs
- No apparel shall convey a sexually suggestive picture, design, word, or remark
- No apparel shall reference the use of drugs, alcohol or tobacco
- Any apparel, headwear, jewelry, or accessory that, by virtue of its color arrangement, trademark or any other attribute, is specifically identifiable as belonging to a gang is strictly prohibited
- No pajama tops or bottoms
- No over-sized coats/trench coats
- No chains, spikes, or anything with raised studs
- No distracting or unusual hair coloring or styles
- No distracting jewelry such as unusual multiple piercings
- All tattoos must be covered
